'Fire' & more . . . Holly Near in Berkeley

Holly Near, consummate musician and songwriter, enlivens the stage of the Berkeley Community Theater this month, at an April 24 concert following the release of her successful new album, *Fire in the Rain*.

Sharing the stage with Near are Adrienne Torf and bassist Carrie Barton; and sign language interpreter Lynette Taylor, an artist of visual expressionism.

The emotional dexterity of Near's voice conveys a sense of power and hope to people struggling with every-day life through a wide range of musical styles. Her music has always reflected her personal evolution in a political framework.

After performing a lead role in the original Broadway production of *Hair*, Near left a promising career with the established music industry to launch an independent recording and performance career. She was politicized on concert tour in Vietnam during the war. In the early '70s feminism became the basis for her songwriting and activism. Then in 1978 Near came out publicly as a lesbian at the Michigan Womyn's Music Festival. This change in her life has found expression in her last two albums. With the release of *Fire in the Rain* she continues her dedication and love for women, while blending her many political involvements in song.

"Holly Near in Concert" takes place Friday, April 24, 8pm, with tickets priced at \$7 general; \$3.50 for those under 16 or over 60, and for the disabled. Order through BASS outlets or phone-charge: 835-4342.

Gay Chorus Sings Out In April

The San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus presents musical fare ranging from Brahms to Broadway this month — in a series of evening classical concerts, and a one-time-only matinee featuring specialty ensembles within the larger musical group.

The chorus' spring evening concerts emphasize its classical training and repertoire, on a program featuring the works of Brahms, Bruckner, Liszt and Randall Thompson.

Miriam Abramowitsch is guest soloist in the Brahms *Alto Rhapsody*, a lush Romantic work giving full play to her wide vocal range, and in Bruckner's *um Mitternacht*, a serene selection from the Romantic period.

The evening concerts also bring us Liszt's rarely performed *Requiem*; and Randall Thompson's *Testament of Freedom*, set to texts by Thomas Jefferson. Each of the evenings' selections features accompaniment by members of the Berkeley Symphony Orchestra. Dick Kramer is musical director.

The concert program "Brahms, Bruckner, Liszt and Thompson" will be performed Friday, April 17, at SF's First Congregational Church (Post at Mason); again on April 24, at Trinity Episcopal Church (Gough at Bush, SF); and on April 25 at St. Ignatius Church, Fulton at Parker, at USF Campus.

Performances are at 8pm. Tickets are \$4, \$6 and \$8 for the April 17 & 25 performances; and \$6 and \$8 for the April 24 performance.

Or you can enjoy an April 12 special matinee at the First Unitarian Church, with the chorus' three specialty ensembles — the *Chamber Singers*, *Lollipop Guild*, and *Men About Town*.

Mark Penn conducts the *Chamber Singers* in the challenging music of early polyphony, Gregorian chant, and chamber works representing several styles and periods. *The Lollipop Guild* is a barbershop quartet specializing in traditional and unconventional four-part harmony. Meanwhile, Bill Ganz guides the ebullient *Men About Town* through their selections of popular ballads, Broadway show tunes, and vintage dance music.

This special *A Sunday Matinee* takes place April 12, at First Unitarian Church (Franklin at Geary, San Francisco). General admission is \$6.

Lesbian & Gay Health Fair

If you care about your health, but don't care for "attitude" on the part of your practitioner, then check out this month's free health screening for lesbians and gay men — to be held April 11 and 12 in San Francisco as part of Bay Area Health Fair Week.

Sponsored by various feminist and pro-gay health organizations, the screening activities include general medical tests; plus screenings for sexually transmitted disease, and pap smears and breast exams by women examiners. In addition, educational exhibits from a wide variety of community health groups will be on display, with written and visual materials on nutrition, exercise, drug and alcohol problems, v.d., community counseling ser-

vices and medical self-care strategies.

Sponsors of "Health Fair '81" include Bay Area Physicians for Human Rights, the California Lesbian Physician Association, the Lyon-Martin Clinic staff, Northern California Dentists for Human Rights, Health Center No. 1, and the staff of the Men's Clinic and the SF VD Clinic.

The fair takes place Saturday and Sunday (April 11-12), 11am to 5pm at San Francisco's Health Center No. 1 (3850-17th Street, at Pond St.).

Participants must be 18 years of age or older. And no medical treatment will be provided at the fair site.

Clinic benefit honors Del & Phyl

Rita Mae Brown, author of *Rubyfruit Jungle* and an early activist with the modern-day gay and feminist movements, will speak at an April luncheon honoring San Francisco activists Phyllis Lyon and Del Martin. The April 30 luncheon features a special presentation by Mayor Dianne Feinstein, and is to raise bucks for the Lyon-Martin Clinic, a women's health center.

Lyon and Martin have long been active in the gay and women's rights movements. They were among the founders of the Daughters of Bilitis, established in 1955 — the first lesbian organization in the country. They co-authored *Lesbian/Woman* in 1972, and Martin's *Battered Wives* saw publication in 1976. Lyon now sits on the SF Human Rights Commission, and Martin currently serves on the California Commission on Crime Control and Violence Prevention.



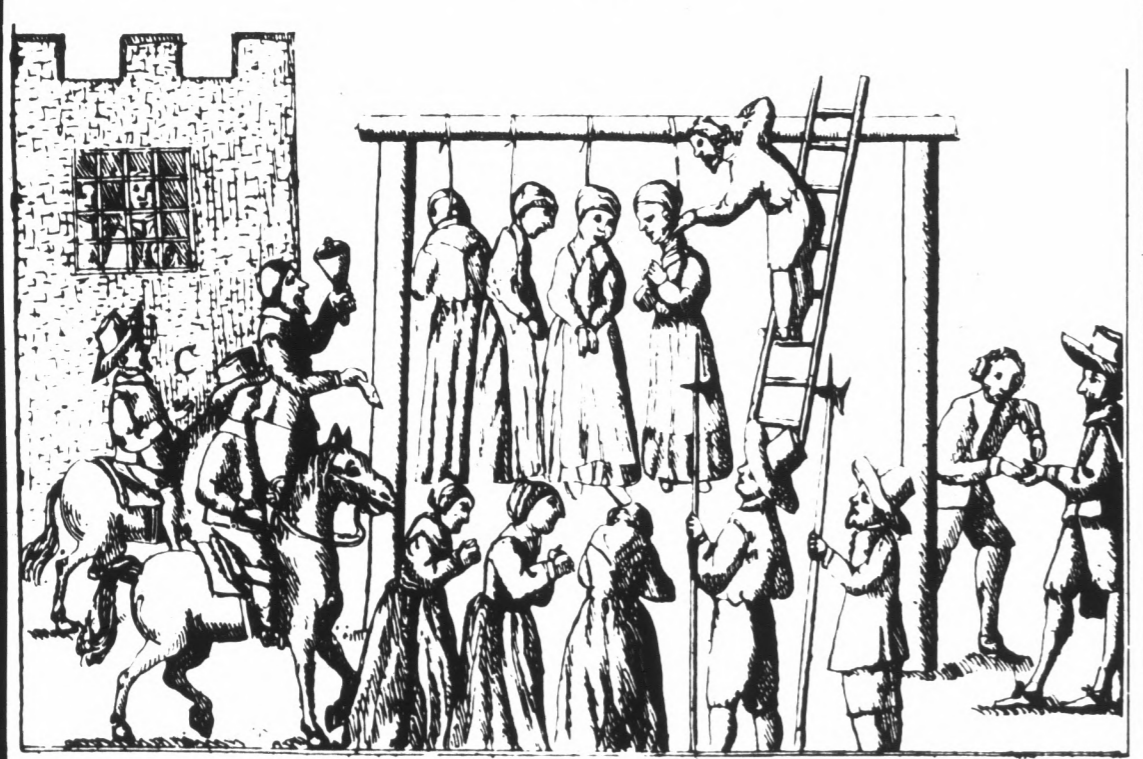

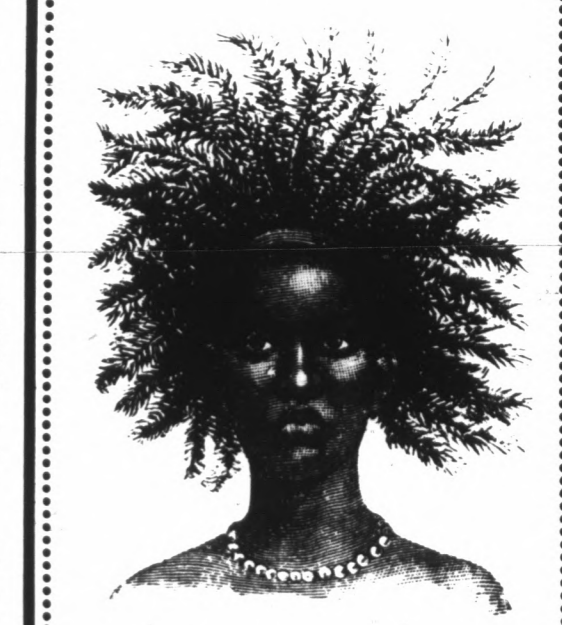

"Our biggest need is for individual bodies to do the actual work and form the various sub-committees," says co-chair Barbara Cameron. "We especially need women, disabled and Third World lesbians and gay men to ensure that the diversity of our community is represented."

This month's general meetings will be held Sundays, April 5 and 19, at the Women's Building in San Francisco (5pm, at 3543-18th St).

International Lesbian/Gay Freedom Day is important because it's a time we all come together to celebrate our struggles for the civil and social rights of all people."
