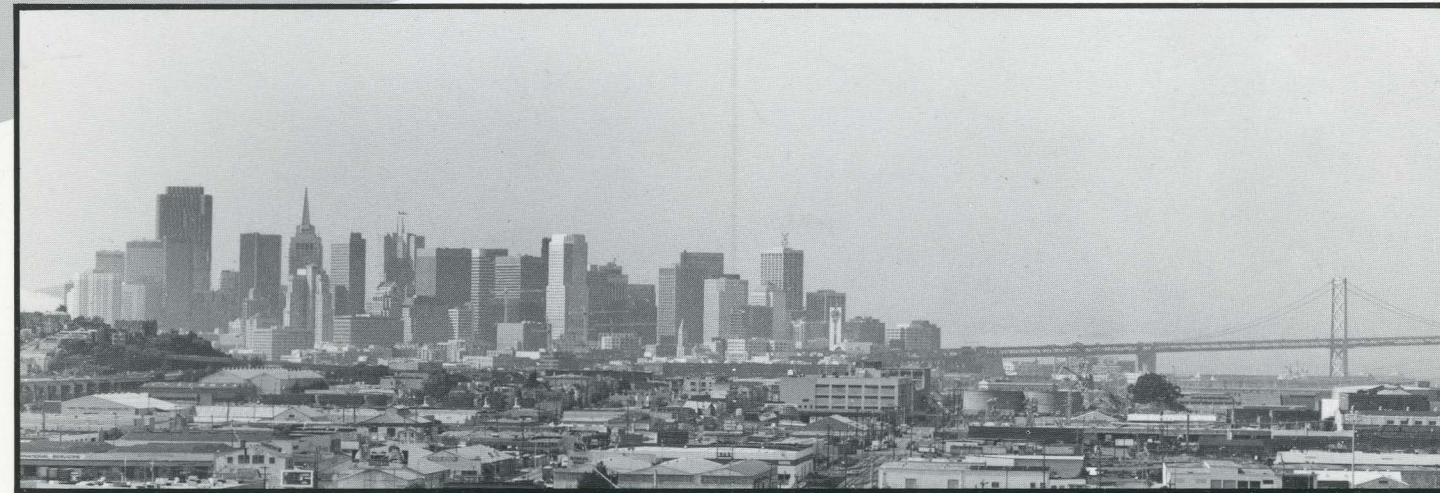

Do You Know These Facts About Bayview-Hunters Point . . .

- The newly developed San Francisco Executive Park features 1.15 million sq. ft. of new office space and will create over 6,000 jobs.
- At George Washington Carver Elementary School, students scoring above the 90th percentile on CTBS tests have doubled since 83-84.
- Housing redevelopment is booming: 1230 low-to-moderate income housing and 144 units of market-rate housing have been completed.
- In 1979, Hilltop Park won a national environmental award presented by the American Landscape Contractors Association.
- At Phillip Burton Academic High School, the percentage of ninth graders who scored above their grade equivalent rose 7.4% from 1984-85 to 1985-86. For tenth graders, this figure rose by 5.9%.
- The private housing ownership rate is now 55% in the Bayview-Hunters Point area, compared to 32% for San Francisco city-wide. 20 years ago in Bayview-Hunters Point, it was only 25%.
- Since 1984-85, Sir Francis Drake Elementary School Grade 3 CAP scores have risen an average of 27%.
- In 1911, the first Bay View Federal Savings office was opened in Bayview. Last year, Bay View Federal's 17 branches were rated #1 in the state for best managed savings and loan of their asset size.
- The Southeast Community College, housed in the Southeast Community Facility, is the newest of San Francisco's community colleges. Adult education courses are offered in fields such as computers and business, as well as general education.
- At Dr. Charles R. Drew Early Childhood Development Center, the first school in San Francisco named after a Black person, reading scores are up 63 points from 1984-85.
- The Martin Luther King swimming pool, located in the Bayview Playground, is the largest public pool in San Francisco.
- The number of Bret Harte Elementary School students scoring above the 90th percentile in CTBS tests has nearly doubled since 1983-84.
- The 170-acre Candlestick Point State Recreation Area, first open to the public in 1983, was the first state urban park in California.
- The new Southeast Community Facility, part of the San Francisco Clean Water Project, houses the Southeast Community College, child care and senior centers, community meeting rooms, and the largest greenhouse in Northern California at 135,000 sq. ft.
- The San Francisco Marathon ran through the Bayview area for the first time in 1986.
- Dr. Martin Luther King Middle School is the newest school in the district. Bordering Bayview, it was the first school in California built with integration funds. Since 1984-85, Grade 6 CAP scores have risen: 17%--reading, 6%--written language, and 17%--math.
- Opened in 1888, the Bayview Opera House is the oldest theatre in San Francisco and the only one to survive the 1906 earthquake.
- The India Basin Industrial Park, a 126-acre business park to be completed in 1988, will increase local job opportunities by 4,000.

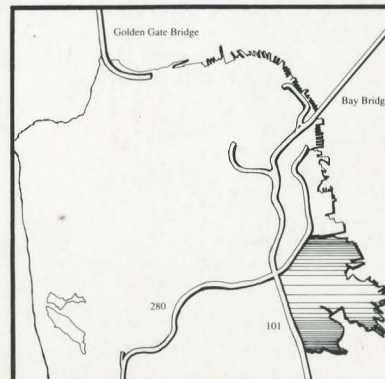
