## Department of Corrections eyeing Bayview site for parole office

### Other areas voiced strong objections

After months of searching, the state Department of Corrections is still trying to nail down space for a new parole office in San Francisco.

The department is currently considering a building in the Bayview District, located at 1970 Carroll Avenue, according to state officials.

If selected, the building would accommodate a staff of 75, including 44 parole agents.

Parole offices serve as meeting places for the agents and the thousands of convicted felons they are charged with keeping track of af-

ter the felons are paroled from state prison.

San Francisco's parole office is currently located at 112 12th Street, near Mission Street.

Deborah Star, deputy regional administrator for the Department of Corrections, says it could be months before the agency decides whether to move into the Carroll Avenue building.

"We're still in the early stages, looking at the lease and talking to the city about any concerns they

may have," she said.

Some neighbors of locations state officials had previously considered moving the office to had voiced strong objections to the plans, most notably on Potrero Hill.

Star says the Carroll Avenue site is currently the only building her department is considering.

"Property in San Francisco right now is moving real fast, and there's not a lot of available space," she

said.

The Carroll Avenue site is a nondescript single-story building between Phelps and Newhall streets. Its immediate neighbors are warehouses and light-industrial buildings, with a few family homes down the block and many others nearby.

The huge new Portola Place housing development and the Bayview Police Station are each less than two blocks away.
