Our Neighborhood is Enjoying its New FACEs

July was a watershed month in the neighborhood. We opened a library! The newly upgraded Excelsior Library reopened with a sidewalk parade, welcome speeches, gifts, food and entertainment. The newly renovated branch, the first library renovation through the Branch Library Improvement Program, has special green features, including solar panels, natural ventilation, open space warmed by wood and natural light, areas for web surfing and added insulation throughout the building. On hand at the opening were Mayor Gavin Newsom, Supervisor Gerardo Sandoval, City Librarian Luis Herrera, City Administrator Ed Lee, Friends of the Library Executive Director Donna Bero, community campaign chairs Grace D'Anca and David Hooper. The library renovation was an exciting neighborhood project and the first done through the Branch Library Improvement Program and couldn't have been done without community fundraising.

We named an amphitheater! Thanks to very hard work by neighborhood folks who have been lobbying for years for a tribute to native son Jerry Garcia, we can proudly show off our efforts. On July 21st., The San Francisco Recreation and Parks Commission voted unanimously to rename the McLaren Park Amphitheater the: Jerry Garcia Amphitheater.

FACE members can be very proud of our contribution to this project. FACE members worked hard to gain approval from the many neighborhood groups and associations that surround the park. We got to know some great folks in Visitation Valley and The Portola who also share a love of McLaren Park. We especially want to thank Friends of McLaren Park who had the vision of this tribute almost 10 years... to Franco Mancini, the current president of FOMP for his tireless lobbying for this park and to the SF Rec & Park Commissioners who gave us a very enthusiastic thumbs up. Well done everyone!

The GGNRA Dog Policy

"Dogs Are Welcome in the Golden Gate National Recreation Area". So reads the notice. However, a recent court ruling has led to a new chapter in the policy. On the table is a Notice of Intent to establish a Negotiated Rulemaking Committee for Dog Management at GGNRA. Because GGNRA is a Federal Park, the rules applying to dog management have to be publicly reviewed. The Notice of Intent invited interested persons to comment on the current dog policy,

including off-leash recreation. The 30-day comment period has now closed. There will be a report published and a committee formed to set policy. This issue is very dear to the hearts of people in our community who enjoy off-leash recreation at Fort Funston and various beaches under GGNRA control. If you are interested in knowing more visit:

The Task Force is charged with reviewing how public funds for the arts are administered and recommending how San Francisco best to sustain and build a viable art community, economy, employment and create low and moderate housing for live/work space in the San Francisco arts community:
