District 11 Loses One of Its Own

On a Sunday evening earlier this month, I joined friends from the Cayuga Improvement Association (The CIA) at Foley's Irish Club to see their president Jo-Carol Davidson compete as a finalist in a cabaret competition. We waited expectantly for Jo to show up, but she never did. About 10:00 p.m. it was announced that she was at Calif. Pacific Hospital. We later learned that she had collapsed on the sidewalk leaving her hairdresser's en-route to Foley's. She was dead at 47 of a cerebral aneurysm.

Friends and family gathered the next weekend for a memorial at Ft. Funston, where Jo often walked her beloved pooch Romeo, and tried to make sense of the loss of such a vital person. In District 11 she was known as a hard-working neighborhood leader, devoted to her community. But she was also a talented songstress and entertainer, and that's how I'll remember her. I couldn't take my eyes off her when she performed. It was like magic seeing a fellow neighborhood activist turned into a glamorous star. And, indeed, she sparkled when she was performing. Jo managed to give something of herself to everyone she met. She gave me a glimpse of the exciting world of cabaret and musical theater, something I never hoped to experience in my life.

In the end, Jo-Carol kept on giving as her husband and life-mate, Tyler, made the decision to donate her organs to help others. (Link to Chronicle article below.)

Geneva Office Building Update

Under the able leadership of Dan Weaver of the OMI, the restoration and seismic upgrade of the old MUNI car barn sailed through approval this week at the Landmarks Board.

By the end of the year the corrugated steel roof will be replaced and the northeast wall stabilized. A skylight will be repaired and years of accumulated pigeon droppings removed. Plywood painted to look like sashes will cover the windows and the building will be weather and pigeon proof.

Then the fundraising will begin. It I s anticipated the building will remain in the current "mothballed" state for approximately five years.
