STATE COLLEGE

San Francisco State College, one of ten California state colleges, was established in 1899. Its first president, Dr. Frederic Burk, opened his State Normal School in a rented building and with an appropriation of \$10,000.

The first graduation class of the school numbered thirty-six young women. In 1906, the building was destroyed by the fire which followed the great earthquake and Dr. Burk selected a site at Haight and Buchanan Streets for the new campus.

In 1921 the school became the San Francisco State Teachers College and in 1935 the program was expanded and the institution became a State College with a broad program in the liberal arts and the sciences to supplement professional work in education. Its present academic program embraces nine operating divisions — Air Science, Business, Creative Arts, Education, Physical Education, Humanities, Language Arts, Science and Social Science.

The college also maintains a demonstration school (elementary) for training teachers in actual classroom work. Located on the campus and operated in conjunction with the college program is the Northern California school for the cerebral palsied.

The present campus, occupied in 1954, contains approximately 94 acres and is located in the southwest section of San Francisco. It includes 12 permanent buildings as well as a number of temporary structures with a total value, including land, of approximately \$20,000,000.

The college is reached by the "M" streetcar from downtown San Francisco or by the Parkmerced bus line.
