* Re-hash! In case you missed it in the Examiner and the Chronicle, the Planning Commission voted recently to extend SF's stringent zoning controls for nine months. The controls were designed to maintain the character of neighborhood commercial districts and to protect family businesses.

Pasticci, Inc.'s primary stockholders are Bill Kingsbury and Maria Luisa Pisano, formerly Italy's Trade Commissioner in SF.

* North Beach is about to acquire a new park, thanks to North Beach Neighbors, who acquired some Open Space money to turn the old Michelangelo Playground into a neighborhood park. The 2.3 acres of open space are located on the south side of Greenwich between Jones and Leavenworth. NBN started a community garden on part of the site three years ago and occasionally their gardeners share fresh herbs with local restaurants.

Now NBN is trying to save money (i.e. your tax dollars) and make it go farther by building Michelangelo Park with volunteer labor and donated materials. SF Friends of the Urban Forest and SF League of Urban Gardeners (SLUG) will be organizing volunteers.

A number of licensed contractors have already committed time. Support from North Beach merchants is vital! Revocation of that permit is on hold for one year subject to two stipulations: 1.) at least 3 valet parkers must be on duty; and 2.) valet parkers must wear orange jumpsuits. In addition, owner Jeffrey Pollack offered the following as additional remedies and the police department encourages follow through in its Notice of Decision:

1. employees are prohibited from parking in the immediate area; 2. Pollack is willing to meet with neighbors to discuss ways of easing parking problems; 3. He will work with Telegraph Hill Dwellers (who will mediate between the restaurant and adjacent neighbors) towards resolving problems and 4.) Pollack will send out letters asking that complaints be sent direct to him.


