### Our Changing Face

A brief history of the neighborhood Contributed by Chris Ortiz

In 1869, the Homestead Association filed with the San Francisco Department of Streets and Maps a plan which delineates the blocks and streets as they exist today in the Portola District. Yet in the early 1900's the Portola District remained largely agricultural. Nurserymen and farmers built their homes here because hot houses dotted San Bruno throughout the U.S. came during and Avenue and vegetable gardens spread out east of San Bruno Avenue. Portola supplied flowers and food for the city. As late as the early 1960's at Bayshore and Paul, now the site of "U-Haul Storage and Rental", two elderly farmers still worked the plot with a horse-drawn plow.

The neigborhood's nicknames, long since discarded, included "Little "Jerusalem" and "The Flat". Many early residents were immigrant Italian and Maltese farmers and nurserymen.

San Bruno Avenue

On San Bruno Avenue many Jewish shopkeepers lived above their stores. Germans and Swedes also settled here. A wave of people from just after the Second World War, many to work at Hunters Point Naval Shipyard.

Today the Portola District, approximately one square mile tucked in the southeast section of the City. has a very hight percentage of owner-occupied single-family homes, many schools and churches, and a busy 9-block business strip along San Bruno Avenue. 

### **Purse Snatching**

Dangerous Duo Raids Portola

At a recent S.F.O.P. meeting police officers from the Bay View Station alerted community members about a pair of purse snatching predators that have been making the rounds in the Portola area. They reportedly operate by one robber acosting unsuspecting residents. while the other one drives the get-away car. Police described the perpetrators as two African-American males in their 20's, driving an old model Buick sedan.

separated by the McLaren Ridge, nor the Bay View from which it is separated by Silver Terrace.

What may be suprising to residents of the area today is the fact that, at one time, Silver Terrace and the new Portola Place neighborhoods were actually a contiguous part of Portola - that is, until the construction of Bayshore Freeway divided our community, if only geographically. In fact, Silver Terrace derives its name from the old "Silver Terrace Nursery" that was prominent in the area, when the freeway was built in the 1950's.

The recent immigration boom has brought new Hispanic and Asian populations who have found a welcoming home in this community. Their cultural contributions have added a new flavor to an already rich mix. Our newest neighbors have sparked new life into the San Bruno Avenue commercial strip.


