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Birth of a Neighborhood

Before the neighborhoods West of Twin Peaks were tamed by municipal improvements, they were sandy spaces occupied by horse racing, farming, dairy ranching, and gunpowder production.

Around 1900, the prospective buyer (with an acquired taste for fog) looked for affordable property near transportation to downtown. Still, the inaccessibility to the new "Parkside" and the up and coming communities of St. Francis Wood and Forest Hill, was a problem. In 1918 the Twin Peaks tunnel literally opened up West of Twin Peaks and made these areas popular for their remoteness from "urban chaos."

As the streets multiplied, the neighborhoods grew. The distinctive builders in these early tracts were Fernando Nelson in West Portal/Merced Manor and Mark Daniels in Forest

Hill (after he laid out Sea Cliff). The "Big 5" post-War builders

(Gellert, Stoneson, the Doelgers, Chris McKeon, and Ray

Galli) are credited with the majority of homes from Lakeshore to the Sunset. Builders borrowed and stole from one another, keeping a weather eye out for what was selling. In the hilly areas the topography influenced house plans and orientation, but in the flatlands, it is architectural homogeneity that is most impressive.

The Red Barn

Why are barns painted red? In the early nineteenth century farmers learned that the color red absorbed sunlight extremely well and was useful in keeping barns warm during winter. The farmers made their red paint from skim milk mixed with the rust shavings of metal fences and nails.


Remodel and Return

KITCHEN REMODEL: The kitchen is key to selling the home. Major remodeling runs \$40,000 and up, while face-life renovations often start at \$15,000. A face lift is likely to return all the money put into it. With a major remodel, you can expect to recover about 80 percent if you sell after five years. For less than five years, try to keep the cost of a major remodel to \$25,000 - you may then recover approximately 90 percent.

BATHROOM ADDITION: Adding a second bathroom is one of the most cost-effective improvements you can make. A ground-level basement bathroom is approximately \$12,000 to \$20,000; adding a basic bath on the first or second floor can add \$3,000 to \$7,000 to the cost. This addition can recover approximately 100 percent of the cost and the property is likely to sell more quickly.

Mango Chutney Chicken

Servings: 6

2 2-lb chickens, cut into quarters

tablespoons unsalted butter

2 tablespoons Curry powder

1/4 cup dry white wine 1-1/2 cups mango chutney, chopped with syrup

In a saucepan, melt butter and stir in curry powder and wine until well blended. Place chicken pieces in a single layer in a baking dish and generously baste with the curry butter mixture. Bake the chicken in a preheated 400° oven for 20 minutes. Remove the chicken from the oven and spread the chutney over each piece of chicken. Bake for an additional 20 minutes. Serve with rice, shredded coconut and sliced bananas.
